Items discussed:

1. **Review/approval of report/minutes**
 - a. 2014 AAS COTSEAL Meeting (Frank & Jolanda)
 - b. Pre-conference COTSEAL officers informal meeting (Sheila)
2. **Update on new COTSEAL financial procedures (Frank & Sheila)**
 - a. COTSEAL has new accounts (with Frank and Sheila as co-signatories) for processing membership fees collected at the annual conference and year round.
 - Paypal account with a phone app for processing credit card payments
 - UW Credit Union account for processing payments made by check, cash or credit card.
 - b. The COTSEAL will periodically forward/transfer monies deposited to the UW account to the AAS CFO, Alicia Williams
 - c. Reimbursements/payments for any COTSEAL expenses will be paid by submitting a formal request to the AAS CFO who will then issue reimbursement/payment checks to individuals concerned.
 - e.g., Expenses for the 2014 COTSEAL Conference, business meeting, and airport runs to pick-up/drop-off the conference keynote speaker
3. **Update on planned COTSEAL activities in 2015 (Frank)**
 - a. Frank: UC-Berkeley is organizing a workshop for SEA Language teachers in September 2015. If funded, it will accept 11 participants from the UC system and 11 participants from other universities in the US.
 - b. Ellen: UW-Madison has applied for funding for a SEA LRC. If funded, there will be \$500 allotted for speakers during the summer. UW has also applied for funding to send participants and trainers to the planned UCB workshop.
 - c. Carol: COTSEAL should also apply to AAS SEAC for small grants to partially fund the workshop and other activities.
 - d. Erlin/consensus: COTSEAL membership should be required to be eligible for funding to participate in the workshop. Participants must be committed to delivering tangible output from the workshop, e.g., syllabus, materials, etc.

- 4. COTSEAL at the 2015 AAS Conference (Frank)**
 - a. Mary Jo Wilson (UW-Madison) is organizing a roundtable discussion: "Realities and Challenges of Distance Language Teaching"
 - b. Juliana Wijaya (UCLA) is organizing a panel presentation: "Language in Politics in Southeast Asia"
 - Frank, Back, Sheila will be part of the panel
- 5. COTSEAL/NCOLCTL membership cancellation**
 - a. The cost of membership and conference fees are too high and there is no tangible benefit to COTSEAL
 - b. The last two conferences have not been positive due to poorly attended SEA language sessions and very little attention given to SEA language teachers and issues in general
- 6. Planning for the 2015 COTSEAL-SEASSI Conference (Jolanda)**
 - a. Explore the possibility of remote conference attendance- SEAsia venue (one or several) to attend via conference streaming, skyping in, etc.
 - b. Reach out to Study Abroad coordinators to find a conference organizer(s)/coordinator(s) in the region- VASI, COTI, CAF, GUAVA, etc.
 - c. Sheila will work with Bac and Lo Pao in organizing the conference next year
 - d. Matching travel grants will be available to presenters next year (\$300 for mainland US and \$400 for Hawaii-based participants)
- 7. JSEALT Online Journal**
 - a. Consensus: We should revive and continue it with no set number of issues and date of issue per year
 - b. It should include sections that feature refereed and non-refereed articles: book reviews, research notes, teaching activities, peer-reviewed papers
 - c. Archive submissions as they come in and publish an issue when enough articles are ready. No set timeline per year but aim to publish one per year or two years.
 - d. Carol: Some members are still willing to be reviewers/referees- Carol Compton, Ellen Rafferty, Bob Bickner, John Hartmann, Erlin Barnard
 - e. Sheila will collect articles and send them out to reviewers; Frank will archive and maintain the website
- 8. The benefits of COTSEAL membership**
 - a. Opportunity to apply for funding to attend professional meetings/conferences
 - b. Get updates when new information is posted on the COTSEAL website
 - c. Network with other professionals in the field
 - d. Attend training opportunities (with full or partial funding)
 - e. Opportunity to publish refereed or non-refereed articles in a professional journal
